

## CHAPTER 18 -SLO-PITCH

## 1. TEAM COMPOSITION

1.1. A team shall be composed of a minimum of twelve (12) participants and a maximum of fifteen (15) participants. One (1) additional spot may be awarded to teams with a qualified coach to a maximum of sixteen (16) participants.
1.2. Each base (for Regionals) or region (for Nationals) may enter one (1) men's and one (1) women's slo-pitch team in the CAF Slo-pitch Championship. The regional team shall be declared champion at the CAF Regional Championship.
1.3. The regional team may augment three (3) players from another B/W/U within the region who have the approval of their Commanding Officer.

## 2. OFFICIALS

2.1. A three (3) person official system will be used through the entire championship when feasible.
2.2. Minor and/or officials that are not officiating on the field will assist as off-field officials, scorekeepers, and/or timekeepers throughout the championship as required by the host base.

## 3. RULES

3.1. Play shall be conducted in accordance with the current rules of the Softball Canada (SBC) Rulebook with the exception of para 6 listed below.
3.2. As per SBC rules the following ball/strike count will apply;
a. Men 1-1; and
b. Women 1-1.
3.3. This paragraph relates to the play format for the CAF Slo-Pitch Championships, which shall include the following rules where:
a. Home Run Rule Limit: A limitation shall be applied to the number of over the fence home runs that may be credited to each team in a game. The rule shall be applied as follows:

- A batter hitting an over the fence home run in excess of the limit shall be ruled out. The ball is dead, no runs will be scored and all runners must return to the base occupied at the time of the pitch.
- Any ball that goes over the fence in fair territory after being touched by a defensive player shall be a four (4) base award and not considered a home run.
- The home run limit per team per game shall be seven (7).


## 4. SUSPENSIONS

4.1. The minimum suspensions listed below will be applied when the following infractions occur during a Championship:

4.2. Reference Chapter 5 - Suspensions, for infractions that may be applied to any sport.

## 5. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

### 5.1. Home vs Away

a. Home team will be identified by wearing dark uniforms and visiting team will be identified by wearing light uniforms;
b. On the schedule, the home team will be listed second. (i.e. 1 vs 3 , team 3 is home team); and
c. Home team will take the dugout on the third base line, the visiting team will take the dugout on the first base line;
5.2. There shall be a two (2) hour time limit for all round-robin games or;
5.3. Seven (7) innings will constitute a legal game, except if tied after seven (7) innings. The game must be played until a winner is declared with the international tiebreaker rule coming into effect in the eighth inning.
5.4. Practice
a. If practice fields are available, there will be a thirty (30) minute warm-up prior to each game. The visiting team will warm-up on the field first, the home team will warm-up on the field second.
b. If practice fields are not available, there we will have a five (5) minute infield/outfield warm-up prior to the game. The visiting team will go outfield, followed by the home team.
5.5. Mercy Rule:
a. Games will end after $21 / 2$ innings of play if the home team is winning by twenty-five (25) or more runs or three (3) complete innings if the visiting team is winning by twenty-five (25) or more runs.
b. Games will end after $31 / 2$ innings of play if the home team is winning by twenty (20) or more runs or four (4) complete innings if the visiting team is winning by twenty (20) or more runs.
c. Games will end after $41 / 2$ innings of play if the home team is winning by fifteen (15) or more runs or five (5) complete innings if the visiting team is winning by fifteen (15) or more runs.
5.6. The CAF Championships shall be conducted as a single round-robin tournament, followed by a modified page system playoff. The final team standings from the round-robin will determine play in the playoffs.
5.7. Home field status will be given to the team that finished higher in the round-robin for quarterfinals and semi-finals. Final home field will be given to the winner of playoff one (1).
5.8. Upon completion of the round-robin, three (3) play-off games will be played. Playoff one (1) will consist of the first $\left(1^{\text {st }}\right)$ place team vs the second $\left(2^{\text {nd }}\right)$ place team with the winning team advancing directly to the final game. Playoff two (2) will consist of the third ( $\left.3^{\text {rd }}\right)$ place team vs the forth ( $\left.4^{\text {th }}\right)$ place team. Playoff three (3) will consist of the winner of playoff two (2) playing the losers of playoff one (1). The winners of the playoff one (1) and the winners of playoff three (3) will advance to the final game.


## 6. TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

6.1. Ties in the final round-robin standings that affect advancement to the playoffs shall be broken as follows:
a. If two (2) teams are tied, the winner of the game between those two (2) teams during the round-robin shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams, in the playoff round;
b. If three (3) or more teams are tied, the team with the best win/loss record, in the round-robin games played between the tied teams shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams, in the playoff round;

Note: In order to use criteria 6.1.b, all subject tied teams must have played each other and one team must have defeated all the teams they are tied with to be ranked higher. The remaining teams then go to next criteria with no reverting back:
c. If a tie remains, the difference plus or minus of total runs scored in games played between the tied teams, with a limit of fifteen (15) plus or minus per game allowed. The team with the best run differential shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams, in the playoff round.
Note: When using criteria 6.1.c if game ended prior to completing an inning the scores will be used at the last complete inning.
d. If the tie still remains, the total runs scored in all games in the round robin will be used. The team with the best bases touched differential shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams in the playoff round.
e. If the tie still remains, the team with the least (fewest) amount of runs scored against in all games in the round robin will be used. The team with the best bases touched differential shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams in the playoff round.
f. If a tie still remains, the jury of appeal in consultation with the chief official shall determine the most appropriate method of breaking the tie (i.e. extra game toss of coin, etc.)
Note: When using the criteria in paragraph 6.1.c, $\underline{\text { 6.1.d, } \underline{6.1 . e} \text {, or 6.1.f. for six (6) }}$ and a half inning games go back to six (6) full innings.
g. After the completion of step 6.1.a, 6.1.b, 6.1.c, 6.1.d, 6.1.e, or 6.1.f, which determines the seeding / ranking of a team, if necessary, repeat the tie-breaking procedures from 6.1.a.

## 7. EQUIPMENT

7.1. The official ball for the CAF Championships shall be in accordance with the Softball Canada rules.
7.2. All members must wear the following equipment listed in the table below:

7.3. Any physical alteration to protective equipment is prohibited;
7.4. Bats:
a. Only Bats approved by Softball Canada, USSSA Bat Certification Program (the logo for USSSA is known as the "Thumbprint" and shown to the right) and/or the CAF Sports Office will be eligible for use in the CAF Slo-pitch.
b. Due to the increase of allowable bat standards available to players at the CAF Championships, teams will be limited to 15 approved
 bats at any one time.
7.5. Strike Mat / Bases:
a. The strike mat shall be $2^{\prime}(0.61 \mathrm{~m}) \times 3^{\prime}(0.91 \mathrm{~m})$ rubber mat with a " V " shaped cut-out $17^{\prime \prime}$ across the top and $12^{\prime \prime}$ on the other two sides, centered $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from the edges of the mat. This mat shall be placed behind the plate so the " V " cut-out fits around the back point of the plate.
b. All bases will be breakaway bases, in addition to the double base (Safe-base) used at first base for all games.

## 8. INJURY PREVENTION

8.1. It is important that injury prevention strategies are reviewed by all members of the team, coaches, officials, athletic trainers, and organizers. Please refer to Chapter 6 for further injury prevention.
9. AWARDS
9.1. At the end of each National Championship game, the Jury of Appeal will select two (2) game MVP's, one (1) from each team.
9.2. The winning teams, in the Men's and Women's competition shall be awarded a banner and a trophy. Individual medals shall be presented to the members of the winning and runner-up team.
9.3. At the end of the National Championships, the Jury of Appeal will select a Tournament MVP for each of the Men and Women Championships.
9.4. At the end of the National Championship, each team will select a Team MVP for each of the Men and Women Championships.
9.5. At the end of the National Championship, each team, men and women, will nominate a player that has exhibited the highest level of sportsmanship including ethical \& responsible behaviour, fair play, integrity and respect combined with a high standard of playing ability. The Jury of Appeal/Chief Official will select the recipients based on the nominations brought forward.
