## CHAPTER 19-SOCCER

## 1. TEAM COMPOSITION

1.1. A team shall be composed of a minimum of fourteen (14) participants and a maximum of eighteen (18) participants. One (1) additional spot may be awarded to teams with a qualified coach to a maximum of nineteen (19) participants.
1.2. Each base/wing (for Regionals) and region (for Nationals) may enter one (1) Men's and one (1) Women's soccer team in the CAF Soccer Championship. The regional team shall be declared champion at the CAF Regional Championship.
1.3. The Regional Men's team may augment three (3) players from another B/W/U within the region who have the approval of their Commanding Officer.
1.4. The Regional Women's team may augment five (5) players from another B/W/U within the region who have the approval of their Commanding Officer.

## 2. OFFICIALS

2.1. A four (4) person official system shall be used throughout the entire championship.

## 3. RULES

3.1. Play shall be in conducted in accordance with the current rules of the Federation of International Football Association (FIFA) Laws of the Game, with the exception of para 7 listed below.
3.2. This paragraph relates to the match format for the CAF Soccer Championships where:
a. There shall be a maximum of five (5) substitutions per match with unlimited substitutions at half time.
b. If a match goes into extra time teams are permitted an additional two (2) substitutions.
Note: 3.2.b is only applicable to matches of 90 minutes.

## 4. SUPENSIONS \& PENALITIES

4.1. The minimum suspensions listed below will be applied when the following infractions occur during a Championship:

4.2. All cards will carry through ALL MATCHES, right up to and including the Final Match. Cards received in the final match will be carried over to the following season's base, regional, and/or national program as per Chapter 5 - Suspensions.
4.3. The Disciplinary Committee and/or JOA has a duty to review any incident further at their discretion to ensure the appropriate suspension(s) are administered, in all circumstances. This will ensure each situation is dealt on its own merit and that the suspension meets the level of the action which led to the circumstance.
4.4. Reference Chapter 5 - Suspensions, for infractions that may be applied to any sport.

## 5. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

5.1. All matches will be conducted in two (2) $x$ forty-five (45) minute halves with a half time that shall not exceed fifteen (15) minutes.
5.2. The CAF Soccer Championship shall be conducted first as a single round-robin tournament, followed by a single elimination playoff. Matches in the round-robin will be played to the end of regulation time. Points will be awarded as follows during round-robin play;
a. Three (3) points for a win (regulation);
b. One (1) point for a tie (shootout win/loss); and
c. Zero (0) points for a regulation loss.
5.3. Should a tie exist following regulation time in round robin play, kicks from the penalty mark shall be taken immediately following the match to determine the winner of the match (IAW FIFA Kicks From the Penalty Mark procedures). No additional points shall be awarded for winning the shootout; the match will be recorded as a tie and each team shall be awarded one (1) point towards their round robin standings as per para 5.2.b.
5.4. All shoot-outs will occur from the Penalty Mark and shall be conducted IAW the FIFA Laws of the Game, Law 10, Determining the outcome of the match, kicks from the penalty mark procedures.
5.5. Upon completion of the round-robin, two semi-final matches will be played. The first ( $\left.1^{\text {st }}\right)$ place team will play the fourth $\left(4^{\text {th }}\right)$ place team and the second $\left(2^{\text {nd }}\right)$ place team will play the third $\left(3^{\text {rd }}\right)$ place team. The winner of each semi-final match will advance to the final match.
5.6. For semi-finals and final matches only, in the event of a tie after the regulation time, extra time will be played to break the tie as per para 7. If a tie still remains, after the extra time, shoot-out will be taken as per para 5.3.


## 6. EXTRA TIME

6.1. Competition/FIFA rules provide for two (2) further equal halves, not exceeding fifteen (15) minutes each in duration to determine the winner. The extra time must be played to completion regardless of how many goals are scored or when. If at the end of extra time the match is a shootout will take place to determine the winner.

## 7. TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURES

7.1. Ties in the final round-robin standings that affect advancement to the playoff shall be broken as follows:
a. If two (2) teams are tied, the winner of the match played between the two (2) teams during the round-robin play, including the results from a shoot-out, shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, , among the tied teams, in the playoff round;
b. If three (3) or more teams are tied, the team with the best win/loss record, in the round-robin matches played between the tied teams, including the results from a shootout, shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams, in the playoff round;
Note: After the completion of step 7.1.b, 7.1.c or 7.1.d, which determines the seeding/ranking of a team, if necessary, repeat the tie-breaking procedures from 7.1.a.
c. If a tie still remains, each team's total goals scored shall be divided by total goals against during the entire round-robin tournament, excluding goals scored or surrendered during shootouts. The team with the highest quotient shall be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams.
d. If a tie still remains, the team with the least amount of points received by yellow or red cards by the end of the round-robin tournament shall advance to and/or be awarded the higher position, among the tied teams. Points will be awarded as follows;

- Yellow Card = One (1) point
- Red Card (indirect) = Three (3) points (as a result of a second yellow card)
- Red Card (direct) = Four (4) points
- Yellow Card and Red Card (direct) = Five (5) points
e. If a tie still remains, a coin toss will determine the team which advances to and/or is awarded the higher position, among the tied teams.


## 8. MATCH ABANDONMENT PROCEDURE

8.1. IAW CSA Lightening policy, a match may be abandon due to the risk of a lightening strike. The safety of the players, official, team officials and anyone else directly involved in the match, will be kept safe from any potential lightning strike or severe weather. The referee has the authority, IAW FIFA Laws of the Game, to stop the match and abandon the match. If this were to occur the results of the match are as follows:
a. If at a minimum $65 \%$ of the match has been played, of actual playing time (not to include the break in between halves) the match will be considered complete. The score, at the time the match is stopped, will be the official final score that will be recorded on the game sheet; and
b. If the minimum of $65 \%$ has not been played:

- the match will be replayed in its entirety (if feasible) at a later date set by the organising committee; or
- If a full match cannot be rescheduled, penalty kicks will be scheduled and will decide winner.


## 9. EQUIPMENT

9.1. The official ball of the championship shall be any ball that meets Law 2 (FIFA Laws of the Game) which includes a FIFA Quality, FIFA Quality Pro, or IMS (International Match Standard) logo on the ball.

9.2. All members must wear the following equipment / uniforms listed in the table below:

9.3. Any physical alteration to protective equipment is prohibited.

## 10. INJURY PREVENTION

10.1. It is important that injury prevention strategies are reviewed by all members of the team, coaches, officials, athletic trainers, and organizers. Please refer to Chapter 6 for further injury prevention.

## 11. AWARDS

11.1. At the end of each National Championship match, the Jury of Appeal will select two (2) match MVP's, one (1) from each team.
11.2. The winning teams, in both the Men's and Women's competition shall be awarded a banner and a trophy. Individual medals shall be presented to the members of the winning and runner-up teams.
11.3. At the end of the Championships, the Jury of Appeal will select a Tournament MVP for each of the Men's and Women's Championships.
11.4. At the end of the National Championships, each team will select a Team MVP, for each of the Men's and Women's Championships.
11.5. At the end of the National Championship, each team, men and women, will nominate a player that has exhibited the highest level of sportsmanship including ethical \& responsible behaviour, fair play, integrity and respect combined with a high standard of playing ability.

The Jury of Appeal and/or Chief Official will select the recipients based on the nominations brought forward.
